#### Text 1

You may have heard of the famous Chinatown in San Francisco. London also has a Chinatown, although not quite as big as its counterpart in America. There are Chinese restaurants, Chinese cinemas, Chinese shops and everywhere the hustle and bustle of Chinese life.

The highlight of the year in this area is the Chinese New Year. On this day during the carnival an exotic papier-mâché lion is led through the streets by his masked tamer and a troupe of dancers. After an elaborate dance, the lion “eats” lettuces and money which the Chinese suspend on the strings from their windows. The lettuce and money eaten in this way is meant to bring the household or business good luck for the coming year.

The Almanac runs in a twelve-year cycle, and each year has a different animal sign, that runs as

follows: fat, ox, tiger, cat, dragon, snake, horse, goat monkey, cockerel, dog and pig.

The Chinese Almanac was started in the Chinese Year 2254 when the Emperor Yao divided the year up into 360 days, thus fixing the seasons so that his farmers knew when to plant their crops. Since then it has grown into a huge book full of information about lunar cycles, astronomical observations and personal fortunes and horoscopes.

Even today, the Chinese take this ancient Almanac very seriously. For example, I have a Chinese friend who now lives in London, but when he was living in China, he was not allowed to marry the girl he wanted to, simply because their fortunes were not compatible in the Almanac. This is not unusual: there are certain marriages (such as rat and horse) which are considered disastrous, and so are never permitted.

These customs are still strictly adhered to in the highly individual Chinese society of London's Chinatown. Despite its position in the heart of a big city, there is still a large percentage of its population who hardly speak a word of English.

The arms and hands of our prehistoric ancestors were probably not very different from the human arm and hand today. The basic structure of the hand with its five fingers was the same. But according to some scientists, there has been an important change - a change in the way we hold things.

Many hundreds of thousands of years ago, our ancestors could hold things in only one way. This is called the power grip. The power grip is used, for example, to hold a hammer or a piece of wood. With this grip, you hold the object in the palm of the hand with four fingers on one side and thumb) on the other.

Later, the human hand developed a second grip, which we call the precision grip. This grip is used, for example, in holding a pen or a paintbrush. With this grip, you have much greater control over what you are holding. The object is usually held by the first three fingers - the thumb, the index finger and the middle finger. With this grip, the little finger (or pinky) and the ring finger do nothing.

The development of the precision grip was important. It made it possible for humans to become tool makers, and so humans became the first and only animals to create and use technology.
