Reading Text 1: THE HUMAN BRAIN – A COMPLEX MACHINE

The human brain is widely regarded as one of the most intricate and powerful organs ever studied. Weighing approximately 1.4 kilograms, it makes up just about 2% of the body's weight, yet it consumes around 20% of the body's total energy. Its importance in nearly every aspect of human experience—thought, movement, emotion, learning, and memory—cannot be overstated.

At the core of the brain's function are neurons, specialized cells that transmit signals through electrical and chemical pathways. These signals allow us to process information, respond to the environment, and carry out basic and complex actions alike. It is estimated that the brain contains nearly 86 billion neurons, forming trillions of connections called synapses.

Different regions of the brain are dedicated to specific functions. For instance, the frontal lobe is associated with planning, critical thinking, and impulse control. The temporal lobe helps us process language and remember experiences. The occipital lobe interprets visual data, while the parietal lobe helps us make sense of touch, temperature, and spatial awareness. These areas operate in harmony, integrating signals to allow for smooth and intelligent behavior.

Despite scientific advancements, many aspects of brain activity remain poorly understood. Neuroscientists continue to explore questions such as how consciousness emerges or how memories are stored and recalled. Technological tools such as fMRI (functional magnetic resonance imaging) and EEG (electroencephalography) have enabled researchers to monitor brain activity safely and in real time, revealing patterns that would otherwise remain hidden.

One of the brain's most fascinating features is its plasticity—its ability to reorganize and adapt. This means that after an injury, or even in old age, the brain can form new connections, learn new skills, or compensate for damaged areas. For example, stroke patients often regain movement or speech after intensive therapy due to this remarkable flexibility.

However, modern life presents new challenges for brain health. High levels of chronic stress, lack of sleep, and overexposure to digital screens can all disrupt normal brain function. Stress hormones such as cortisol can interfere with learning and memory, while inadequate rest can impair concentration and emotional regulation.

To support cognitive function, experts recommend a combination of physical activity, mental exercises (like puzzles or reading), balanced nutrition, and sufficient rest. Social interaction and time spent in nature have also been shown to promote positive brain development and emotional well-being.

In short, the brain is not only the command center of the human body but also a dynamic organ capable of growth, repair, and adaptation throughout life.

Reading text 2: THE WORLD'S OLDEST LEATHER SHOE – DISCOVERED IN ARMENIA

In 2008, a team of Armenian and international archaeologists made an extraordinary discovery inside the Areni-1 cave, located in the Vayots Dzor region of Armenia. Buried beneath layers of sheep dung and preserved by the cool, dry climate of the cave, researchers uncovered a single leather shoe that dates back over 5,500 years. The item is believed to be the oldest known leather shoe in existence, dating to around 3,500 BCE, during the Chalcolithic period.

The shoe was made from a single piece of cowhide and appears to have been carefully shaped to fit the right foot. It features a closed-toe design and was fastened with laces threaded through leather eyelets. Measuring approximately 24.5 centimeters in length, the shoe corresponds to a modern European women's size 37. Inside the shoe, archaeologists found grass, which may have been used as isolation to protect against heat or cold, or simply to help the shoe retain its shape during storage.

This remarkable find is notable not only for its age and condition but also for what it reveals about the **technological and cultural practices** of early humans living in the Armenian highlands. The craftsmanship suggests that prehistoric people already possessed advanced skills in working with leather and had a need for durable, protective footwear as they clearly understood its practical implications. Though the shoe is simple in design, it demonstrates practical knowledge and material efficiency that are surprisingly modern.

Interestingly, the shoe was not found with a matching pair, nor were any other items of clothing discovered nearby. However, the excavation site revealed numerous other artifacts, including ceramic vessels, obsidian tools, and remnants of plant and animal material. This variety of finds points to a multi-purpose use of the cave, likely combining **domestic life with ceremonial or ritual activities**.

Researchers believe that the shoe's excellent preservation was due to a fortunate combination of environmental factors—stable temperature, low humidity, and the protective cover of organic materials. The discovery has since contributed valuable data to the study of early human settlement in the region and continues to attract attention from historians, archaeologists, and the public alike.
