Costs of Living (estimated)	Semester fee: ~130 EUR/6 months (including public transport) Accommodation: 220 – 350 EUR/month Food: 180 EUR/month Plus private expenses Living expenses average between 720- 800 EUR per month (BA/MA students). The actual costs may vary. The proof of finance demanded by the visa office is 10.236 EUR/year (853/month) for student visa holders.
Semester Fee	There are no tuition fees applicable at the Saarland University. However, it is mandatory for students to pay a small fee corresponding to: - The administrative cost related to the establishment of the Student ID card - The semester ticket which allows for public transportation in the federal state of Saarland. The fee for exchange students is currently around 130 EUR per semester. The student ID card also entitles students to a various number of discounts e.g. subsidised meal prices in the canteen on campus and for several activities off-campus. www.asta.uni-saarland.de/index.php/semesterticket
Health Insurance	A valid health insurance is mandatory for the enrolment: European Health Insurance Card delivered to all EU citizens. All incoming Erasmus students will be provided with detailed information about the health insurance (EU and Non-EU citizens).
